The Chrismon Tree is used in Christian churches over the world THE CALL TO WORSHIP as a means of praising and proclaiming the Christ. *The Hymn No. 158..... "Angels We Have Heard on High" The evergreen tree is a symbol of our eternal life, won for us by Christ Jesus, and is used as a background for tiny white lights and white and gold Chrismons. The lights speak of Him who is the Light of the World, and the Chrismons (CHRIST *The Invocation + MONogram) proclaim the Name, the life, and the saving acts of Jesus, the Christ. The Welcome and Announcements Chrismons are usually made in combinations of white and gold. White is the liturgical color for Christmas and refers to our Lord's purity and perfection; gold, to His majesty and *The Hymn No. 157..... "Away in a Manger" glory. Some Chrismons are simply copies of signs and symbols of A CHRISTMAS STORY Christianity from its earliest days. Others are newer explanations of God's never-changing presence. Some are *The Hymn No. 184..... "Thou Didst Leave Thy Throne" combinations of many different elements, old and new.
