The Invitation

The Great Prayer of Thanksgiving

L: The peace of the Lord be with you.

L: Lift up your hearts.

P: We lift them up to the Lord.

L: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

P: It is right to give him thanks and praise.

L: Father, all powerful and ever-living God, we will always and everywhere give you thanks and praise through Jesus Christ our Lord, In him you have renewed all things and you have given all who believe in him a share in his riches.

Though his nature was divine, he stripped himself of glory and by shedding his blood on the cross he brought his peace to the world and reconciliation between people. He was exalted above all creation and became the source of eternal life to all who serve him.
