According to his son, World Communion Sunday grew out of the Division of Stewardship at Shadyside in an attempt to bring churches together in a service of Christian unity—where everyone might receive both inspiration and information, and above all, to know how important the Church of Jesus Christ is, and how each congregation is interconnected with one with another. Later, the celebration was adopted by other churches in the USA and Christian churches worldwide.
