The Presenting of the Holly and the Poinsettia

Leader: Holly and the Poinsettia have become symbols of Christ’s passion, the holly
with its prickly leaves represents the crown of thorns; the berries of the holly and the
leaves of the poinsettia represent the blood shed for us; the bitter bark of the holly symbolizes the drink Jesus
was offered on the cross.

The Hanging of the Garlands

Evergreens have long been considered a symbol of eternity, like God’s everlasting nature. The ancients
regarded evergreens as a symbol of peace, joy and victory.
Early Christians placed them in their windows to indicate that Christ has entered their home. Garland comes
from the French word meaning “wreath of flowers”.
Garlands usually are comprised of a circular band of flowers or foliage.
We hang garlands of evergreens to remind us of God’s vastness,
God’s abiding love in Jesus Christ and our never ending fellowship with God.

The Lighting of the Chrismon Tree

Leader: In ancient times the cedar was known as the tree of royalty.
Today we often use cedar, along with other greens...
pine, fir, spruce, juniper, and rosemary...
which we prize for their fragrance as well as their symbolism
of our expectation and hope of the coming of the Christ child again.
As we light our tree,
we remember that Christ is ever-present and that he is the “Tree of Life”.
The lights on our tree remind us that the Christ Child came to earth as
the “light of the world.”

The Giving of the Chrismons

Leader: The word Chrismon comes from a combination of Christ’s Monograms.
Chrismons are symbolic of the life of Christ and the meaning of Christmas.
They are usually handmade by the congregation in colors of white and gold...
white for the purity of Christ, and gold for His royalty.
