The Ouestion

Why do we light four candles?

The Meaning

This is the fourth Sunday of Advent.

Each year on the four Sundays preceding our celebration of Christmas Day we prepare ourselves for the coming of our Savior.

We light the first candle, the Candle of Prophecy, to remember the prophet's promise of Christ's coming to be the savior of the world.

We light the second candle, the Candle of Bethlehem, to remember the dark night when Joseph and Mary found light and warmth in the stable.

We light the third candle, the Shepherd's candle to remember the great light and joy which surrounded the shepherds at the announcement of Jesus' birth.

We light the fourth candle, the Angel's candle to remember the glorious announcement that an angel of the Lord made to the shepherds of the Messiah's birth.

The fourth candle is **rose** signifying the Messiah's suffering for the sins of the world.
