The Babb Project—Community Outreach



We are thrilled to have been awarded the **Diaconal Ministry Grant** from the Presbytery to serve the Babb Project. We hope to be able to fund a "uniform closet" at the school for homeless and other transient or disadvantaged students who have no uniforms. Various sizes of shirts and pants will be available for these children. Additionally, we will continue to provide weekend food bags and uniforms for the 22 children at the bottom of the poverty level referred to us from the school. This is double the number we served last year, so this grant will help us meet that need as well.

Remember that: Next Sunday, October 29, we will celebrate Reformation with Kirkin' of the Tartans - so wear your native dress and come prepared to look at our Presbyterian heritage. After the service we will have our annual **Congregational, Corporation, and Cemetery Trustee** meeting, with election of 3 elders and annual financial reports.
