Does God Give Christians Favor?

God certainly does grant favor to his children. Psalms 90:17 (NIV) says, "May the favor of the Lord our God rest upon us; establish the work of our hands for us - yes, establish the work of our hands." Additionally, the Apostle Paul in his second letter to the Corinthians said, "In the time of my favor I heard you, and in the day of salvation I helped you. I tell you, now is the time of God's favor, now is the day of salvation." (II Cor 6:2 NIV) I would encourage a search of the word favor in the New International Version. The word appears dozens and dozens of time throughout Scripture. Many of those uses refer specifically to the favor of the Lord upon his people.

Psalms 112 (NIV) is an interesting case study in the favor that the Lord grants upon his people "who fear the Lord and find great delight in his commands." While the word favor doesn't appear in this particular chapter, the concept can certainly be seen as expressed in the chapter as 'blessings'. Verse 2 promises that this man's children will be mighty in the land; verse 3 speaks to the prosperity of the committed person; verse 4 speaks of light dawning for the upright in the midst of darkness, etc. Each verse in that chapter is packed full of promises to the man who fears the Lord and delights in his commands. It is important to consider that God showing favor to His people is not the same as 'favoritism'. Acts 10:34 (NIV) tells us that God does not show favoritism.

A couple of years or so I went on a personal retreat at the Monastery in Conyers with the intent of staying the night. No room in the inn. So I went passed the chain that kept visitors out of the sanctuary and sat down to pray for a while. During that time God reminded me He had been good to me. I agreed. He said I have given you a lot of favor. I agreed. Then He said from now on you will be my FAVOR-MEISTER. When I tell you and only when I remind you I want you to pray for people but only those I bring to mind. I said God there no such word as meister. Then I looked it up and it is German for Master. So God selectively has me prayer for favor because there is no such other Word that God has to show He grants favor and blessing in His providence.

FROM THE CLERK ...

It did not occur to me until a recent circle meeting that several of you may not be aware that you - Philadelphia congregants - helped birth a new church! Elder Philippe Karka approached the Session awhile back about the possibility of our sending a financial contribution to help support the work of an ecumenical group of ministers in his home country of Togo in Africa. The purpose of ATLET, the minister group, was to carry the word of God out to villages and rural areas where the word had not yet been preached. The Session voted to send \$200 to help support this ministry.

Philippe shared with us a report received from Essokoussinam Soukoude, President of ATLET, following completion of the 2012 evangelism campaign which ran last fall. Sixty-two people from six churches (Presbyterian Evangelical Church of Togo, Assembly of God, Baptist, Deep Life, Catholic, and Pentecostal) participated in the campaign, visiting 203 families in outlying areas. Those visits resulted in 64 professions of faith: 12 men, 15 women and 37 young girls and boys and the establishment of a new Presbyterian church to be supervised by the Presbyterian Church of Togo! Our support of this effort was to have been "known to all the members" during their General Assembly meeting in January, 2013.

A copy of Mr. Soukoude's letter (along with Philippe's kind translation of the French), and a list of the names of the members of the new church will be passed along to Philadelphia's current historian, Nancy Phillips, to be placed in church history for 2012.

So congratulations! You helped birth a church and carry out the Great Commission to "go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Sprit. Matthew 28:19
