THE CROSSROADS

Thoughts from your Pastor,

Philadelphia Presbyterian Church is a praying church. The prayers of the righteous (and occasionally the marginally righteous) avails much. That has certainly been the case in my life, as well as, the life of this congregation and her individual members.

I invite us to strengthen our prayer life during the fifty days between Easter and Pentecost (the 'season' of Easter) (http://www.presbyterianmission.org/ministries/worship/season-easter/) by making a covenant with God and one another to pray each day for PPC, her members and friends, neighbors living near our church and our homes, and the Presbyterian Church USA, the denomination of which we are a part.

Below are a couple of patterns for prayer based on easy to remember acronyms. The first has been extremely helpful for me. There are several interpretations of the acronym but Mary Lou Redding, editor of the Upper Room described it as follows in the Upper Room Prayer Center.

A-C-T-S

- A Adoration (worship, praise)
- C Confession
- T Thanksgiving
- S Supplication (requests)

Mary Redding goes on to say. "We begin by adoring God, acknowledging who God is. Then we confess our failures and our need for God and ask for forgiveness. Next we express thanks, acknowledging God as the source of all we have, all our blessings. Finally, we state our requests, supplications, to God for what we need and want. This model can help us to pray more freely by giving us a way to search our hearts for what we want to say to God..."

The word B-L-E-S-S is a pattern that was new to me. But it, too, can guide us in praying for others. It was created by Dr. Alvin VanderGriend in his book, Love to Pray: A 40-Day Devotional for Deepening Your Prayer Life.

- B Body. Pray for health/healing, for "daily bread"/physical needs to be met.
- L Labors. Pray for God's help in the person's work, school, daily tasks.
- E Emotional needs. Pray for comfort, reassurance, hope, joy, peace, etc.
- S Social needs. Pray for healthy relationships with family, friends, associates.
- S Spiritual needs. Pray for continually deepening relationship with God.

I hope these patterns will be helpful to some of you as we pray our way to Pentecost. There is no "right" or "wrong" way to lift praise and petitions to God. The most important thing is to take time each and every day to earnestly pray for God's will and way to be manifest in this day and time. Through prayer PPC can and will become even more faithful in following in the footsteps of our Lord and Savior. Jesus Christ.

The Session of Philadelphia Presbyterian Church held its monthly business meeting on March 15, 2015. The Financial Committee reported the PPC February 28 financial report as follows:

Balance in the Operating Fund \$26,774.52
Total Assets 88.267.84
Total Revenue February 12,435.45
Total Expenses February 11,159.59
Balance for February 1,275.86

- Session met with Minister Joan Gray for new Book of Order training and review.
- Session reviewed the results of the Cat Scan survey with Joy Fisher.
- Rick Pierce, Philippe Karka and Pastor Wilson attended the first quarter Presbytery Meeting at Central Presbyterian. A vote was held on change to the Book of Order definition of marriage.
- Session approved per capita payment to the Presbytery of \$2980.90 and a Benevolence gift of \$1019.10 for the year 2015.
- Worship approved plans for a self-guided Stations of the Cross path through the Church grounds and Memory Garden.
