Graduations, birthdays and holidays often cause us to comment on the changes we see in children or grandchildren. Seldom do we connect those observations to the fact that we, too, have changed since the last time we saw one another.

Change is inevitable. We can't stop it. We can't avoid it. We can't control it. While reading (and writing) this article, food from our last meal is being changed into calories, nutrients and waste. New cells are replacing old. If you are over 20, it's said that gravity has already started its downward pull on our face, neck, back, chest, shoulders, legs and internal organs.

The earth itself is changing. We witness that through seasonal changes in our environment. An overwhelming majority of respectable scientists now agree that our climate is changing at an alarming rate. Every nanosecond changes are occurring in every place and every universe.

Thousands of years ago, the preacher known as Ecclesiastes observed that there was nothing new under the sun. In many respects this is true. But when old things take on new characteristics, to us they may seem "new" when in fact they have only changed.

The song says "Everything Must Change" but God never does. God alone is the same yesterday, today and forever. God alone is the only constant. Few Christians would argue with this statement of faith. Yet, we tend to resist the inevitable changes that are taking place in our bodies, families, homes, workplaces and churches.

I've often noticed that the strongest resistance to change tends to surface when fear overrides faith. Here are a few ideas that may help combat those fears:

Recognize God as the Change Agent because God is Sovereign

Accept change as part of God's plan to restore all of God's Creation

Anticipate change and prayerfully prepare for it

Embrace change and expect God to provide a future and a hope

If God is in control, if God is good, if God loves and cares about us there is no need to fear change. On the contrary, if these statements are true (and they are) we can be peaceful, hopeful and joyful knowing that everything will work out for good.
