THE CROSSROADS

Thoughts from your Pastor,

For I know the plans I have for you, declares the Lord, plans for good and not for evil, to give you a future and a hope.

Jeremiah 29:11

It's hard to believe that I've been at PPC for almost a year. There have been numerous changes during that time and we've accomplished a lot, especially considering my half time status. Yet, many are still unclear about my role as your Contract Call Pastor (CCP) serving during this time of transition. So it may be time to address that subject.

As I see it, a CCP is basically an "Interim 3.0". The position calls for more skill sets and time to prepare a congregation to receive its next installed pastor. Yet, the job description is essentially the same, "to coach, guide and encourage congregations during the in-between time". However, in addition to providing basic pastoral services, such as worship leadership and pastoral care a CCP also provides healing and clarity for a congregation as it moves through the process of preparing for, searching for and calling a new leader.

As is the case with most interim positions, a CCP is expected to assist a congregation with 5 Developmental Tasks: Coming to terms with history good, bad or indifferent; Discovering a new identity that reflects present realities; Managing changes in leadership so it becomes more healthy, empowering, positive and creative; Strengthening denominational linkages and the congregation's sense of belonging to the wider church; and Preparing for new leadership and a new future by strengthen the church's capacity to be a growing, changing, forward-looking body.

A CCP may also concentrate on organizing for ministry, mission and church growth, helping church staff adjust to the new reality and helping the congregation plan events to enhance fellowship and outreach. She may also help church leaders prepare the congregation to receive a new Pastor by reviewing and if necessary rewriting the vision, mission and goal statements.

In the midst of any transition several things will happen to one degree or another, with various results, whether those involved are aware of them or not. Done well with intentionality a congregation will not only have a good transition from one pastorate to another, but a renewed sense of purpose and vision, new energy for ministry, choose appropriate new leadership both lay and clergy and be committed to their purpose, vision and ministry. These are my goals and expectations for PPC because I believe the Lord has great plans for you.






ATTENTION PRESBYTERIAN WOMEN
