From Your Fastor's Desk,

Then Jesus said to his disciples, "Those who want to come with me must say no to the things they want, pick up their crosses, and follow me. (Mt. 16:24 God's Word Translation)

Cross bearing is far from comfortable. Comfort and peace are great blessings from the Lord who loves us so much that Jesus Christ and the Holy Spirit were sent to be with us. But the comfort and peace God offers is not the same as that offered by the world.

The Christian and the congregation, that are too comfortable on this side of glory, can also become weak and dependent on the false securities of life instead of the Lord. There is nothing wrong with being comfortable unless that comfort makes us depend on God less and causes us to become complacent about the unsaved, the unchurched and the unloved around us.

Rather than seeking to remain in comfort zones of our own making during times of transition and change, we may want to consider the following prayer, attributed to Sir Frances Drake.

Disturb Us, Lord

Disturb us, Lord, when
We are too well pleased with ourselves,
When our dreams have come true
Because we have dreamed too little,
When we arrived safely
Because we sailed too close to the shore.

Disturb us, Lord, when
With the abundance of things we possess
We have lost our thirst
For the waters of life;
Having fallen in love with life,
We have ceased to dream of eternity
And in our efforts to build a new earth,
We have allowed our vision
Of the new Heaven to dim.

Disturb us, Lord, to dare more boldly, To venture on wider seas Where storms will show your mastery; Where losing sight of land, We shall find the stars.

We ask You to push back
The horizons of our hopes;
And to push into the future
In strength, courage, hope, and love.
