From Your Fastor's Desk,

And he gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the shepherds and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, until we all attain to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to maturity, to the measure of the stature of the fullness of Christ. Ephesians 4:11-13

The CAT Scan is finished. Session has listened to the congregation and made many difficult, yet necessary, decisions The PNC has been elected and commissioned. Now begins the waiting and wondering about who God will select as the next pastor for Philadelphia PC.

It's expected that congregations will become anxious or impatient with the Presbyterian process during this time. But, in the midst of the transition, there are several things any member can do to alay their fears while strengthening the church:

- Demonstrate your faith This is not a time to relinquish church responsibilities or slack off in tithing
 or attendance. Your commitment is to God, not to a pastor.
- Share the gospel Some churches actually grow during a time of transition. Invite friends and family to church. Share your faith journey at every opportunity.
- Find a place to serve God's plan for the church is for every member of the body of Christ to work together. Rather than becoming complacent, seek a place to work or serve.
- Be positive Attitude is everything and it helps set the pace for a successful transition period.
- Most of all...Pray without ceasing...
 - $\sqrt{}$ For God's vision and direction to be revealed and embraced
 - $\sqrt{}$ For your current session, pastor and other leaders
 - $\sqrt{}$ For the ministry your new pastor may be leaving
 - $\sqrt{}$ For yourself as you prepare to accept and support a new leader
 - $\sqrt{}$ For the ability to be humble during the process and after the new pastor arrives
 - $\sqrt{}$ And, for members of the PNC. Say thank you. Drop them an encouraging note on occasion. Support them but don't impede their progress by probing for information. They will provide periodic updates to the entire church.

Christ is still in complete control of His church. He knows what PPC needs in this season. Once everyone surrenders their agendas to God's agenda, PPC will be ready to receive the next pastor God has chosen for this church. This isn't business as usual because souls are at stake.

Session is preparing to search for three Elders for the Class of 2019. A congregational meeting in September will appoint a Congregational Search committee to serve for the coming year.
