From Your Pastor's Desk

So those who welcomed his message were baptized... They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers...And day by day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved. Acts 2:41ff

Most realize the importance of an annual check-up to maintain physical health. Seldom do churches apply that thinking their spiritual health. This portion of an article by Pastor Jack Wellman* provides a starting place to examine on the health of PPC. Hope it is interesting, informative and helpful.

A healthy church is one where members are disciplined whenever necessary, to ensure that the sacraments are administered regularly and that biblical teaching are consistently taught to feed the flock so that they can grow and mature toward the stature or nature of Christ. The early church grew rapidly because "they devoted themselves to the apostle's teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers" (Acts 2:42) "And all who believed were together and had all things in common" (Acts 2:44). When they were continually "praising God and having favor with all the people...the Lord added to their number day by day those who were being saved" (Acts 2:47).

There are three things mentioned in the early church that caused growth: They devoted themselves to the apostle's teachings, which they had received from Christ; they had fellowship and the breaking of bread, which meant meeting often and eating together often in homes; and they prayed. If any one of these three are missing the church will not function the way it was designed to function. These three essentials resulted in God growing the church.

A church that grows is also one that goes. This means that they seek those who are lost as part of the imperative command given by Christ just before His ascension. Jesus mission on earth was to rescue the perishing and the church must have that same purpose if she is to grow. God will not bless any church that does not care about the lost. This is what Christ did and the word Christian means to be "Christ-like" or "little-Christ's" and to be following in the footsteps that He took while on earth and He was sent "to seek that which was lost".

Where are the strengths of PPC? How might PPC become healthier and stronger? What might you do to help in that effort? "In the words of Mark Dever, "A healthy church is a congregation that increasingly reflects God's character as his character has been revealed in his Word."
