

Philadelphia Presbyterian Church Cemetery

You may recall from last month's article that a congregation meeting was held on December 3, 1972 for the purpose of acting on a proposal to move control of the Cemetery from the Session to a newly formed Cemetery Board of Trustees.

The original board members were Judge Harold Banke, Mrs. Ollie Conine, Mr. Ed Huie, Mr. J. L. "Looney" Lasseter and Judge Charles "Charlie" Reynolds.

Reading the minutes of that Congregation Meeting brought back a lot of memories. Long time member John Shannon was Clerk of Session. He recorded in his Minutes that Philadelphia Presbyterian Church had approximately 500 members.

Ok, so I got a bit off track but I know the above information put a smile on some of your faces.

The official Cemetery Rules set forth the following guidelines. Burial plots are not now and have never been sold. To qualify for burial plot assignment you must be a member of PPC. Each adult member is entitled to 4 burial plots. The church member and his immediate family (defined as spouse, children, mother, father) may be interred in the member's assigned spaces. If a member moves or no longer has a need for spaces previously assigned, those spaces are returned to the Cemetery Inventory for reassignment to other church members. Burial space(s) CANNOT be sold to non church members. In addition to traditional burial plots members may inter or scatter cremains in designated areas.

Next month we will look at how Trustees are elected and their responsibilities .



Session Summary...

The Session of Philadelphia Presbyterian Church held its monthly business meeting on July 17, 2017. The Financial Committee reported the PPC June 2017 financial report as follows:

Total Revenue June	\$15, 632.45
Total Expenses June	\$13, 201.92
Balance for June	\$2,430. 53
Balance in the Operating Fund	\$27, 352.73
Total Assets *	\$88, 128.33

*(This includes operating fund, money market, and investments in cd's)

YTD Revenue	\$78, 230.85
YTD Expenses	\$79,390.32
Difference of	(\$1,159.47)

In other news:

As you know, our building is in need of some “sprucing” up when it comes to the outside appearance. For the last couple of months Jim Phillips and Fred Rohrbach have been gathering information into the cost of either repainting the Church exterior or replacing the exterior. We have received 4 quotes for the various costs involved in this project. Session approved forming a committee for the purpose of going over the bids to see which is going to be the best choice. If you are asked to be on this committee, we hope you will help with this important task.

In addition to forming a committee to look at the bids for the Church exterior, Session also approved forming a committee which will be tasked with how to pay for the cost of the exterior project. While we do have the funds to cover the costs, we feel it's important to not just rely on our current assets. If you are asked to be on this committee, we hope you will help with this important task.

We are excited to share with you that the Church received a grant from Presbytery for the purpose of helping with Mallory Banke's dance ministry. In the fall of last year, Philippe Karka wrote a grant proposal for the dance ministry and submitted it to Presbytery. When he rolled off of Session, Eliot Lawrence took over Outreach and has continued to monitor its process. The grant money will be used for such things as costumes, the room they practice in, etc. We are excited about this new ministry and hope you are too.

As some of you may know, Hal Banke has decided to step down as the Sunday School Superintendent. Hal has faithfully served in this role for many years and has decided to retire. We would like to thank Hal for a job well done.

In years past, we would have “Rally Day” in August to mark the beginning of a new Sunday School year. We are looking to have a luncheon towards the end of August - date to be determined – to not only kick off a new Sunday School year but to also recognize and “thank” our Sunday school teachers and Superintendent. We are still trying to finalize the date so be on the lookout for an announcement.

One final note – We are in need of a Sunday School Superintendent. If you would be interested in serving in this capacity please let either myself or one of the other elders know.
