We did so that day traveling through the cold and blustery snow.

Many Thanksgivings have come and gone since that day. Grandma and Grandpa Rowl and Lowell, Helen, and my mother and father have gone to their heavenly Father but the warm memories of love and thankfulness that I felt on that day in that special place still remain. Soon Thanksgiving Day will again be upon us. I hope it, too, will be a most memorable one for all of us. Until then, I hope to see you in worship as we continue to give thanks and praise to God each week.
