Dear Philadelphia Presbyterian Church Family,

On Wednesday, March 6, 2019 Christian churches throughout the world will be observing Ash Wednesday as the church prepares for the celebration of the mystery of Easter and the Resurrection of our Lord. The invitation to this discipline during the Lenten Season in the Christian Church (found in our Book of Common Worship) says:

"Friends in Christ, every year at the time of the Christian Passover we celebrate our redemption through the death and resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ. Lent is a time to prepare for this celebration and to renew our life in the paschal mystery. We begin this holy season by acknowledging our need for repentance, and for the mercy and forgiveness proclaimed in the gospel of Jesus Christ.

We begin our journey to Easter with the sign of the ashes. This ancient sign speaks of the frailty and uncertainty of human life, and marks the penitence of this community.

I invite you, therefore, in the name of Christ, to observe a holy Lent by self-examination and penitence, by prayer and fasting, by works of love, and by reading and meditating on the Word of God."

Though we are not gathering for worship at Philadelphia on Ash Wednesday, you may wish to attend a church near you that will be. For your personal time of worship on Ash Wednesday you may wish to meditate on the following Scripture: Isaiah 58: 1-1; Psalm 51: 1-17 and Matthew 6: 1-6, 16-21. However you worship on Ash Wednesday, I hope you will draw near to Jesus and spend time in His presence.
