PW Budget and Expenses Update as of Nov. 17, 2020: Of the \$2885 PW 2020 budget, our Women have been wonderful this year despite not being able to have our regular Circle meetings and have contributed \$2412 toward this budget. In addition, \$830 has been contributed to special PW offerings such as the PW Birthday Offering, Least Coin, Blessing Boxes, Columbia Friendship Circle, and the Mary & Martha Foreign Child. All our budgeted PW benevolences have been paid to Presbytery and now we are doing our other benevolences, such as Securus House, sponsorship of a Thornwell cottage, World Wide Missions Project, etc. Plus we have also paid other expenses such as the Horizon Bible study books for the coming year. Cancellation of the PW Fall Retreat and the Cantata reception eliminated those expenses this year. As of Nov 17, PW has a \$1293 balance with \$1110 to be paid by the end of the year, with an anticipated balance of \$183. Thank You for your continued faith and generosity through this challenging year! ---Debbie Bray

PPC Clerk's Corner

Greetings from the Philadelphia Session,

I hope this finds you and your family continuing to stay well and practicing your "social distancing" and that you have managed to stay in touch with your family and those closest to you. As you know we have started having service at church again while still posting service live on Facebook. Thank you for your patience as we are navigating 'new waters' – technically. We've had a couple of hiccups but for the most part things seem to have gone well. We are practicing the guidelines that we put in place and so far everything seems to be going well.

The Session met on November 12, 2020 via Zoom to conduct our monthly business. One of the items discussed involved the replacement of furnace in the Education wing of the Fellowship Hall building. The replacement of the furnace was approved. This was long overdue and unfortunately the parts that were needed are no longer available. As of 11-11-2020 our financial information was as follows:

Total Assets - \$50,128.81 Monthly Total Revenue – as of 11-11-20 - \$13,066.20 YTD Revenue – as of 11-11-20 - \$132, 298.72 Monthly Total Expenses – as of 11-11-20 - \$17,251.98 YTD Expenses – as of 11-11-20 - \$127,906.08

In the October Crossroads I mentioned a way that we could help at Camp Calvin. There are three International seminary students who are currently living at Calvin Center. They are living there because Columbia Seminary Campus is shut down and there is minimal housing available due to the pandemic. Their food and board is being provided for but they have very little left over for other necessities. They could use gift cards to such places as Walmart or Kroger. Even gas cards would be appreciated and as always, cash would be helpful. We recently had the opportunity to have one of them preach for us. Please consider helping these students. If you are interested in helping you can contact John Westlund at Calvin Center or you can just drop something in the mail. Any help will be greatly appreciated.

As we enter into the Advent Season, please know that we will do some things a little differently this year. While we will miss the 'Hanging of the Green' on the first day of Advent – the church will still be decorated. We will have the opportunity to hear beautiful Christmas music even though we will not have a Cantata this year. We will have our Christmas Eve service – it will just be done a little differently this year. If nothing else, this year – 2020 – has taught us all that we have to be flexible when it comes to some things, and that we need to take the time to actually appreciate ALL that we have. We need to be willing to make some sacrifices for each other and to not think of only ourselves. This hasn't been an easy year for any of us but we are so richly blessed because we have God. It is my hope and prayer that each of us – especially myself – take the time during the month of December to truly reflect on what Christmas is all about. May God bless each of you and your family during this Advent season and in 2021. As the saying goes – "We know not what the future holds, but we know who holds the future."
