Greetings from the Philadelphia Session,

I hope this finds you and your family continuing to stay well and practicing your "social distancing". It's hard to believe that we have been doing this now for a little over 6 months. I hope you have managed to stay in touch with your family and those closest to you. I just wanted to remind you that you are able to view Reverend Westlund's and Reverend Sundermeier's sermons on our church Facebook page. If you aren't on Facebook, you can still access the sermons by going to the church webpage. Rick Pierce has been uploading the sermons there for members to be able to view. The Church webpage is www.ppc-usa.org. The Session met on September 1, 2020 via Zoom. During this meeting we once again discussed the possibility of reopening the church. Based on the current data at that time regarding the virus it was decided that we would keep the Church closed at least until the end of September with a goal in mind of re-opening in October.

The Session had an additional meeting on September 24, 2020 via Zoom. At this meeting, it was decided that we would re-open the Church for in person service on October 18, 2020. In order for us to re-open the church there are several protocols that all members and visitors will be asked and expected to follow. It is our goal to keep everyone safe and healthy and able to worship in our Church again. However, if you aren't ready to return yet – we will understand. It is our plan to continue to provide our worship service through the church Facebook page and the church webpage. We will try to livestream our Sunday service on Facebook, but if there are technical difficulties we will record the sermon and post it for viewing later that day. **ALSO, please take note that we WILL NOT start with Sunday school yet.**

Below are the protocols that ALL members and visitors will be asked to follow.

Protocols for Congregation and visitors:

1. No ushers - Fred will be at the back door and will provide guidance/info
2. Bulletins will be placed on a table in the Narthex for individuals to pick up
3. Masks will be REQUIRED and are to be worn throughout the service.
4. Hand sanitizer will be available on the pews that seating is allowed.
- 5.. Doors will be open whenever/wherever possible
6. There will be NO SINGING during service.
7. Offertory plates will be in the Narthex. Members can place their tithes there.
8. Please sit with whomever you come with.
9. We encourage you to greet one another but please do not hug, etc.
10. If you don't feel well, please don't come to church.

Financial Update

We continue to receive rental money from the Hispanic Church that is using some of the space in the Education Building and this too has helped cover some of the normal expenses at the church.

We have continued to have our "Coffee Meet" on Zoom every other Sunday and for those who have attended it has been good to see you. Our next 'Coffee Meet' is supposed to be on October 4, 2020 so we hope you will make plans to join us. The 'Coffee Meet' starts at 10:30a.m. It's very informal and you don't have to drink coffee to come. It's an opportunity for us to see one another and just catch up on how folks are doing. If you are interested in joining us but need help with getting Zoom set up on your computer, please reach out to either Rick Pierce or Eliot Lawrence for assistance. Both gentlemen have offered to help anyone who is interested.

We recently learned of an opportunity – a way we can help. There are three International seminary students who are currently living at Calvin Center. They are living there because Columbia Seminary Campus is shut down and there is minimal housing available due to the pandemic. Their food and board is being provided for but they have very little left over for other necessities. They could use gift cards to such places as Walmart or Kroger. Even gas cards would be appreciated and as always, cash would be helpful. Please consider helping these students. If you are interested in helping you can contact John Westlund at Calvin Center or you can just drop something in the mail. Any help will be greatly appreciated.

We are looking forward to seeing you on October 18, 2020. If you have any questions concerning the protocols or anything else, please reach out to any of the elders. 
