Dear Friends in Christ,

Well, I don't even look at the weather report anymore. Daily highs close to 90 and afternoon thunderstorms. Got it. Our yard is turning into a swamp, and the humidity keeps me from staying outdoors for very long. I don't know how the Rohrbachs do all that landscaping work.

And believe it or not, school starts August 2. I'm sorry, school administrators, but that is just plumb crazy. I think of children on hot school buses and in hot classrooms and trying to play outdoors on a dirt playground in the heat, and it doesn't make sense to me. When I was growing up in western N.C., we started school the day after Labor Day and we ended the Friday before Memorial Day. Only when we'd had a lot of snow days off did we ever have to go into June. So I just don't get this almost year round school business. I know children have missed a lot of learning this past year doing online learning at home, but kids still need play time and time to do absolutely nothing of consequence. I remember lying on the cool terrazzo brick floor of our back porch after bicycling home from 3 hours of swim team practice and not even reading – just chillin' out, sometimes with a small circulating fan blowing on my face. We didn't have air conditioning until I was in high school, and even then it was those window units that would freeze up once a week.

I lived on a dead end street (we didn't have a thing called a cul-de-sac in those days either – the road just stopped at the creek), and there were over 20 children and as many dogs in the neighborhood. Summer was playing in the creek, playing kick the can, riding bicycles, and swimming at the community center. My brother and I would bike 2 miles to the community center in the morning for swim team practice, come home and eat lunch, rest a little on that cool back porch, and then bike back to play and swim in the same pool all afternoon. Then after supper, we'd play outdoors until dark. Parents would start appearing on front porches calling us in about dusk, and they might find us outside or they might find us in a neighbor's house. It was total freedom, and I cherished those summers.

When I got my first job after college and realized I couldn't take summers off, it was a shock. What?? You work 50 weeks a year with 10 days vacation? What had I gotten myself into, growing up? How come adults didn't get to have fun? I'm still not over it. Growing up was the pits – paying bills, cooking all my own food, keeping my car in running order, doing constant home maintenance – and that was before children came along.

So in my humble opinion, our children need that "do nothing" time in the summer as long as they can. And if we can just lock up their cell phones and video games, I bet they'll even learn to enjoy that time of being free of distractions. I'm looking forward to my first vacation since January, 2020, in late September. I won't have to cook, I won't have to make up the bed, I won't have to do the laundry, and I'll even get to see some interesting sights. And I just might lie on a deck chair and "do nothing."

Hope you get some "do nothing" time this August.

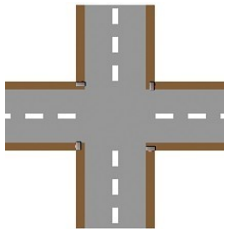
