The Session met on December 10, 2020 via Zoom to conduct our monthly business. As of 12-15-2020 our financial information was as follows:

Total Assets - \$49,373.61

Monthly Total Revenue – as of 12-15-20 - \$16,166.99

YTD Revenue – as of 12-15-20 - \$148,465.71

Monthly Total Expenses – as of 12-15-20 - \$16,666.27

YTD Expenses – as of 12-15-20 - \$144,572.35
