May God continue to bless each of you and your families.



Save Postage Stamps from your Mail for the Alliance Stamp Ministry

The Alliance Stamp Ministry in Fort Myers, FL uses the money from sale of used postage stamps to print and distribute Spanish language Sunday School materials to over 50 countries all around the world, including Latin America, Spain, and the US. They accept all stamps -- cancelled and non-cancelled stamps and any kind of postage that can be stuck to a letter or package. They require a 1/4 to 1/3 inch border around the stamp when cut from the envelope or package. Note that larger commemorative stamps and stamps of greater cost than regular first class are worth more. So save stamps from all of your mail -- you can give them to Debbie Bray.


