Dear Friends in Christ,

Well, we've unmasked and now we're going to have a meal together. Save the date for breakfast at 9:30 on Easter morning, April 17. Jim Phillips and crew are going to do pancakes and eggs and all the fixins. I can't wait – I've heard about this famous breakfast for a year and I've been salivating – waiting to indulge!

As we approach Holy Week during this season of Lent, please also mark your calendars for the noon Good Friday service. We will listen to the Passion Narrative from Luke and the choir will contribute meaningful music to that story.

As Greg and I talk about ordering palms for Palm Sunday, I am reminded of the circular liturgical year, with us just burning those palms from last year and marking our foreheads with them on Ash Wednesday. Jesus enters Jerusalem in triumph, only to immediately encounter open animosity from the Jewish religious leaders. The week that begins with Hosannas of acclamation ends with death and days of darkness while we await the resurrection of the Messiah. From palms to ashes. From Hosanna's to silence. From hurried burial before Passover starts to an empty tomb. Such enormous dichotomies in the final week of this man's journey. I am reminded of words from Isaiah 53:

He was despised and rejected by others; a man of suffering and acquainted with infirmity; and as one from whom others hide their faces he was despised, and we held him of no account. Surely he has borne our infirmities and carried our diseases; yet we accounted him stricken, struck down by God, and afflicted. But he was wounded for our transgressions, crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the punishment that made us whole, and by his bruises we are healed. All we like sheep have gone astray; we have all turned to our own way, and the Lord has laid on him the iniquity of us all. He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he did not open his mouth; like a lamb that is led to the slaughter, and like a sheep that before its shearers is silent, so he did not open his mouth.

He was wounded for us, he was oppressed, for us, and yet – and yet – he did not open his mouth in protest. Thanks be to God for this Savior that we don't deserve.


