THE CROSSROADS

Dear Friends in Christ,

We are waiting, once again. For 28 days, we will worship as we wait for the promise that God gave to Isaiah and other Old Testament prophets – the coming of Emmanuel, or "God with us." As we wait in joyful expectation, we celebrate old church rituals: hanging of the greens, purple paraments, Chrismons on trees, and singing of carols. Worship begins with the lighting of a candle on the Advent wreath as we focus on the five major themes of the Christmas season: Hope, Peace, Joy, Love, and on Christmas Day, Light. Churches borrow a tradition from Mexico with poinsettias, that bloom in the winter there. These flowers are called Flor de la Noche Buena (Flower of the Holy Night), due to their resemblance to the Star of Bethlehem.

We love the smells of the season – Christmas trees, scented candles, peppermint, and cinnamon. We love the food at Christmas – we feast once again almost like Thanksgiving. It is a time of gift giving and receiving, of sharing our blessings by contributing food and toys and clothing to those in need.

And my favorite of all – Christmas lights. I'm legally blind without my contacts or glasses, and when I was little, our Christmas tree had those older, bigger colored lights. I would take off my glasses and stand there in awe of all the big, fuzzy colors. Sometimes I still do that. Our tree can switch from white to colored lights, and from blinking to steady lights, so I tap the floor switch with my glasses off and watch the colors change. It's magic, and a big part of Christmas is magic – elves and Santa Claus and Frosty the Snowman and the North Pole. Our children get so excited they can't sleep. We get excited as we wrap presents and empty our stockings on Christmas morning. Our only admonition is to try to not get too overwrought with the consumer version of Christmas. I try to remember that the fuzzy lights are as magical as any fancy present.

Light seems to be everywhere – on lamp posts, in store windows, in our own windows, on our bushes, and even along our driveways. It's the shortest time of the year, and we want that light to brighten our nights and our moods. We end the Christmas Eve service with lit candles and the singing of Silent Night, and go out into the cold in joy, knowing that the birth of the baby is imminent. We read the Christmas story in Luke remembering once again the story that begins "In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world." We know what the rest of the story says, but we love hearing it again anyway.

This season I hope you will come to church and celebrate this season of light. We will hang the greens on November 27, we will have special music each Sunday, we will have a Christmas Concert on Saturday, December 17, and our Christmas breakfast on December 18. On Saturday, Christmas Eve, we will hear the Christmas story and light our candles, and on Christmas Day, you will be able to listen to a short service on Facebook from the comfort of your home. Christmas is coming. Oh come, oh come, Emmanuel. Let us rejoice in that coming.

Community Outreach—The Babb Project

Each Friday afternoon, the staff at Babb Middle School send home bags of food items with some of the students who are homeless or very low income so that they can eat over the weekend. We have partnered with them to provide some of the needed

items for these bags. **FOR CHRISTMAS:** We are collecting hats, gloves, & scarves for the students. There are 5 girls and 6 boys involved. We would need these items by <u>December 11</u>.

<u>Breakfast Items:</u> Individually wrapped cereal, Pop tarts Cereal bars, Granola bars, Nutria-grain bars, Individual packs of Grits or Oatmeal, etc.

<u>Lunch Entrees:</u> (*in microwavable containers*) Ravioli with Meat Sauce, Spaghetti O's with Meatballs, Individually wrapped Mac and Cheese, Vienna Sausages, Beef Stew, Red Beans and Rice, Beans and Franks, Beef a Roni, Soup, Corn Beef Hash, Ramen Noodles, etc.

Juice Boxes, Milk Boxes (shelf-safe)

<u>Snacks:</u> Dried or canned fruits, fruit chews, peanut butter crackers, cheese crackers, goldfish, pudding or jello cups, mini microwave popcorn, etc.
