As you all take a deep breath from the hubbub of the holidays, I hope you can be grateful for time with your families. I am so glad we were able to have the Christmas Cantata this year and Christmas Eve services, in spite of ongoing COVID concerns. I pray for a new year with diminishing needs for separation. We need each other, and we all miss our luncheon get togethers!

Thank you for your generosity this past year to all our outreach programs. Securus house should be grateful for the outpouring of gifts for their families. You supported the Morrow Food Bank, Kinship care with school supplies, the Forest Park Ministry program to send food home with students for the weekend, and you were generous in support of the Shepherd Clinic. In addition to local programs, you gave money for Thornwell Home for Children, The One Great Hour of Sharing, Joy Gift, and other PC(USA) mission programs.

As we start the new year, I hope you will consider giving donations to the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance program, to help victims of the tornados in the Midwestern and Eastern states. The PDA program is active in Kentucky and other nearby states. In fact, the First Presbyterian Church of Mayfield, the first religious organization in Mayfield, established in 1832, completely lost its historic 1915 building in the recent tornado. The members were invited to use a wood cabinet manufacturing building nearby. The PDA disaster team reports that local areas in the path of these tornadoes are getting overwhelmed with donations of material goods, with few places to store them. The best way to help at the moment is to send funds to PDA so they can buy what is needed or pay for temporary housing. So please think about beginning the year with a donation. Just make your check out to Philadelphia Pres and put PDA in the memo line.

We are back in "ordinary" time (think green paraments) until Ash Wednesday begins the Lenten season March 2. That will mark my first anniversary with you as your pastor. It has been a wonderful year of getting to know all of you and your traditions. I love the old wooden communion trays, and the manger scene, where you add a character or two each Sunday during Advent until the baby and the Wise Men finally arrive. I have never in my life seen a Christmas tree as big and beautiful as the one Greg Durden procured for us. I'm hoping we will be back to Fourth of July picnic and celebration of our veterans, and that our Fellowship Hall is going to start getting some heavy use. Meanwhile, you all feed me with your grace and prayers. I thank God for each of you.
