

Dear Friends in Christ,

We are entering the season where we look at budgets, elect nominating committee members, evaluate our outreach programs, and basically do some ministry-related housekeeping. As we prepare for a busy season of special Sundays like Reformation Sunday, and meals like our Thanksgiving dinner, we also look at where we are going as a church, and what we need to do to get there.

We had a recent scare with the air conditioning system. When we were quoted \$28,000 -35,000 to replace the sanctuary A/C, I started praying. And thankfully, another company was able to repair the one we've got for about \$5000, so we have some relief for a while. I'm impressed by the stewardship of our Session and our Treasurer. They guard our money carefully and try to make our limited dollars go further. But occasionally things happen – like lightning that damaged part of our equipment, and just the age of our infrastructure. So as we begin our stewardship season, I hope you will prayerfully consider what you can offer the church next year.

We not only need funds, we need your time and talents. We need three new elders, and we've made it easier for you to serve. Terms are two years in length, not three, and we hold our session meetings via Zoom on Tuesday evenings for a little over an hour. We value your time and we are aware that most of you have served before and are familiar with how PPC works. We need elders to oversee our worship, finances, and ministries, and we need elders who have wisdom. We value your recommendations, and your volunteerism! Please consider serving, especially if it's been a while. We won't make you come back to the church for night meetings, we won't make you give speeches or sing solos (if you don't want to), and we won't make you go out and beg folks for money. But we do need three good souls who believe in our mission as a church and want to help keep us on the right path. So think about it! And as that blonde lady in Cumming who sells Toyotas says on TV, "Don't make me come get you!"
