THE CROSSROADS

Dear Friends in Christ,

As we prepare for Holy Week and Easter, I hope you are reading your Lenten devotions and worshipping with us as we journey with Jesus toward the cross. We have met interesting characters along the way in Sunday sermons – the Samaritan woman at the well; the man born blind; Lazarus, Mary, and Martha; Caiaphas, and the woman who anointed Jesus' head with oil; and Judas. Judas, who turned Jesus over to Caiaphas and the authorities for 30 pieces of silver, after complaining about the woman wasting precious money on costly ointment that could have been given to the poor. I always wonder what he thought he was going to do with that money. He had Jesus arrested, and had to know that the Sanhedrin intended to put Jesus to death. So what was Judas going to do next, with Jesus gone? Was he going to go join some other group of zealots and give them the money for some purpose? We'll never know, because he committed suicide after Jesus was condemned to death. He tried to repent, saying he had sinned by betraying innocent blood, but the Sanhedrin wouldn't take the money back, and they wouldn't undo the death sentence.

Please join us at noon on Good Friday to listen to the story of the events of Holy Week, and to ponder in quiet the death of Jesus. And then join us on Easter Sunday morning for breakfast together at 9:30 and a celebration of the empty tomb. May our walk during this time be one of thankfulness for the Son of God who came to claim us, to forgive us, and to love us.

Community Outreach—The Babb Project



Each Friday afternoon, the staff at Babb Middle School send home bags of food items with some of the students who are homeless or very low income so that they can eat over the weekend. We have partnered with them to provide some of the needed items for these bags.

Breakfast Items: Individually wrapped cereal, Pop tarts

Cereal bars, Granola bars, Nutria-grain bars, Individual packs of Grits or Oatmeal, etc.

<u>Lunch Entrees:</u> (in microwavable containers) Ravioli with Meat Sauce, Spaghetti O's with Meatballs, Individually wrapped Mac and Cheese, Vienna Sausages, Beef Stew, Red Beans and Rice, Beans and Franks, Beef a Roni, Soup, Corn Beef Hash, Ramen Noodles, etc. Juice Boxes, Milk Boxes (shelf-safe)

<u>Snacks:</u> Dried or canned fruits, fruit chews, peanut butter crackers, cheese crackers, goldfish, pudding or jello cups, mini microwave popcorn, etc.
