I just returned from Come See Columbia Day at the seminary, and it was a joyous time seeing old friends and colleagues. Jim, Debbie Durden, and I attended from Philadelphia, and we enjoyed the sermon by one of the Columbia Friendship Circle scholarship winners. Dana Abu Ghazaleh is from Jordan, and in that country there is no such thing as a woman minister. She never thought about ministry until her husband was transferred to the U.S. And here she was today, preaching a wonderful sermon to over 150 of us. She introduced herself to us all at lunch and said that when she preached for the very first time, it was via Zoom, so she had her parents log in to watch. She is the first Palestinian Christian woman from Jordan to ever preach a sermon. An awe-inspiring day. If you get a chance next year, please join us for worship, a seminary class, and a wonderful lunch where we meet the scholarship recipients. The other scholarship recipient is Nicole Jiskoot who assisted in worship. She was a middle school history and English teacher for 17 years before being called to the ministry. She had her second child the day after classes started several years ago and took one class via Zoom while she was still in the hospital!

Dr. Victor Oloyo, the new seminary President, also spoke to us. I am proud of being an alumnus from this fine institution and it always does my soul good to go back and learn something new. Speaking of new, Debbie, Jim and I sat in on Dr. Bill Brown's class on "The Seven Ecological Hits of the Bible." He only got through four, and now we all MUST find out what the other three are!!! A short recap of the first four: Genesis 1 (the 7 day Genesis Code of creation), Genesis 2 (Adam's creation), Hosea 4 (the land mourns), and Psalm 148 (all creation praises God). When I find out the other 3, I'll let you know.

I hope you will be inspired this spring and summer to learn something new about the Bible and your faith!

Making Miracles Group Home Phase II Group Home, Tallahassee, Florida: Making Miracles Group Home (MMGH) helps young mothers break the cycle of abusive relationships, addiction, incarceration and early motherhood—a repeating pattern that is difficult to break and overcome. Since its inception in 2010, MMGH has served over 100 women and their children by providing a one-year, live-in program designed to support young mothers and help them develop skills to live independently and care for their children. Current eligibility criteria require residents to be pregnant and/or have a single child up to age three, but mothers who have a single child older than age three or multiple children often seek help. With the Birthday Offering grant, MMGH will purchase a second group home to serve an additional five families who are at risk of experiencing homelessness. With loving support and tools to establish stable, permanent housing, these families can look forward to a hopeful and successful future.

Berhane Yesus Elementary School Kindergarten School Construction. Berhane Yesus Elementary School, located in the western highlands of Ethiopia, seeks to change lives by sharing the "Light of Jesus" and by providing the best possible educational experience for the children of Dembi Dollo. Berhane Yesus provides children with the possibility of a better future by preparing them for a rigorous high school education and a life of Christian service. The school is the first entry point to education for children of subsistence farmers, migrant workers and displaced groups of people. This K-8th grade school has been serving the community and been a part of the Presbyterian Church in this rural community since 1921. A kindergarten was added to the school in 2012, but with no available space for class, the children met in the chapel. Over the years the number of kindergarten students has increased and now space of their own is not only needed but is required by the government to remain open. Western Wollega Bethel Synod provided land for the classroom and the Birthday Offering grant will provide all necessary funding for its construction.
