Babb Project Report

Thank you to everyone who has supported the Babb Project thru out the past few years. Because of your generosity, we are able to supply weekend food bags for 13 homeless students. In November, we were able to purchase them school uniforms, and in December we are purchasing warm hoodies and scarves. We are always in need of food items that we give the students each week. Breakfast Items: Individually wrapped cereal, Pop tarts, Cereal bars, Granola bars, Nutri-grain bars, Individual ready to serve cups of Grits or Oatmeal, etc. Lunch Entrees: (in microwavable containers) Ravioli with Meat Sauce, Spaghetti O's with Meatballs, Individually wrapped Mac and Cheese, Vienna Sausages, Beef stew, Red Beans and Rice, Beans and Franks, Beef a Roni, Soup, Corn Beef Hash, Ramen Noodles, etc. Juice Boxes, Milk Boxes (in pourable containers & shelf-safe) Snacks: Dried or canned fruits, fruit chews, peanut butter crackers, cheese crackers, goldfish, pudding or jello cups, mini microwave popcorn, etc. in individually wrapped bags. SECUR'US HOUSE is Clayton County's refuge for abused women and their children. Each Christmas we ask everyone, who's able, to bring a gift for the children. The children range in age from babies to 17. Do not wrap them so Securus can direct their distribution.

Some suggested gift items are:

toys, games, cars, trucks, baby dolls, puzzles, crayons & coloring books, all kinds of children's books.

We will also be collecting some of their needed supplies. You may bring your donations in right away. Place them in the collection bin in the narthex.

Shelter items needed:

Items for infants & children include: diapers (all sizes, but esp. large & x-large) ,baby oil, baby wipes & Vaseline, bottles with nipples, socks, underwear & undershirts (all sizes), crayons, coloring books, markers

Items for the women include: new underwear (all sizes), pajamas, gowns & slippers (all sizes), personal hygiene products, hair blow dryers, hair care products for women of all color

Items for the shelter include: toiletries (deodorant, shampoo, bar soap), paper towels, toilet tissue & facial tissues, tooth brushes, toothpaste & mouthwash, first aid products, lip balm

Total Assets—\$90,245.63

YTD Identified Offerings—\$119,679.54

Monthly Total Expenses—\$22,124.53

YTD Expenses—\$168,946.06

Monthly Surplus/Deficit—\$4,431.73—surplus

YTD Surplus/Deficit—(\$13,493.34)

Dear Women of the Church,

Thank you for your continued support of the Campbell's soup label collection for Thornwell Orphanage and for the Stamps that you collect for the Stamp Ministry.

I wanted to take a minute to share a bit of information on the Stamp Ministry. The stamps that we collect are sent to a location in Florida where they are sorted and sold. The monies from the sale are used to continue support of preparing, publishing and distributing Spanish Language curriculum for Sunday Schools. Your stamps help impact churches of 40 different denominations and missions in 19 different Spanish speaking countries! The guidelines for stamp collection are much broader than what we have been collecting and I want you to have the updated information. The Stamp Ministry still asks that we leave a border of ½ to 1/3" and to not remove any stamps from paper. They also will take stamps that are not on paper. The list of what they will take is long and the only thing that I see that they don't want is metered mail nor the permit number of businesses and organizations. A summary of what they will take is listed here for anyone interested in the details! They will take:

Small common ½ cent through current postal rate including Hanukkah, Kawanza, EID, Purple Heart and Celebrate and etc.;

Christmas stamps which includes Winter Birds, Winter Berries and Winter Scenes;

High value stamps – anything over the current first class postal rate;

Air Mail stamps;

Presorted, pre cancelled, nonprofit and bulk rate (these are glued on stamps not information printed on paper);

Large commemoratives stamps (usually rectangular or larger squares); Express stamps \$2.90, \$8.75, \$9.95, \$10.95 and up;

Priority stamps \$2.40, \$2.90 and up; Love stamps; foreign stamps ON paper and OFF paper;

Canadian stamps;

Uncancelled stamps;

Computer generated postage (with an illustration or a photograph or with a black mosaic rectangle);

Stamps that are pre-printed on envelopes;

Damaged stamps;

Stamps off paper.

As you can see it is a long list! I also found out that they collect picture post cards both unused and used and request that if the post card is used to please leave the stamps on the cards.

I love how generous our community of women are and as I send off another full package of Stamps to the Stamp Ministry, I am grateful!
